

ASSESSING THE SECOND TERM PERFORMANCE OF THE NANA ADDO PRESIDENCY: HOW EACH CONSTITUENCY, REGION, AND THE COUNTRY RATED THE SECOND TERM

We model the 2024 election results and look at how each constituency, region and the country as a whole rated the second term performance of the Akuffo Addo led administration. The Performance Rating Model (PRM) developed by EN Analytics aims to provide an empirical framework for measuring the performance of each administration at the end its 4-year tenure. In this way, we can have a consistent criterion that is applicable to all administrations and that is devoid of biases through polling. We believe that election results are the most definitive data source for assessing the performance of our leaders and we want the data to speak for itself. The rating model is based on 7 carefully selected outcomes: Excellent, Strongly Approve, Approve, Acceptable, Disapprove, Strongly Disapprove, and Abysmal. In all, 275 constituencies are included in the statistical model (refer to methodology for further details).

The sharp reversal of fortunes for the NPP in the 2024 elections reflects the economic realities of voters, who endured high cost of living and saw their purchasing power eroded. At the end of Nana Addo’s second term, the total national debt of the oil-rich and mineral-rich nation has ballooned to GHS 750 billion from the GHS 122 billion when he took office, representing a 514% increase. Inflation had remained persistent and year-on-year inflation reached a high of 54.1% in December 2022. In that same month of December 2022, the debt-distress country (per IMF classification) suspended its debt-servicing obligation to its international creditors, citing inability to pay. It was therefore not surprising that international credit rating agencies like Fitch and Moody downgraded the country’s sovereign debt to “junk” status. The country was, and still is , locked out of the international capital market due to the high risk of default associated with the country’s sovereign bonds. Due to the faltering economic and financial situation at the time, the country had no choice but to resort to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for a US\$ 3 billion bailout.

At the domestic front, many Ghanaians lost significant portions of their investments as bondholders were forced to exchange high-yielding investments with shorter maturity periods with low- yielding financial instruments with longer maturity periods. At the end of his term, thousands of individuals and hundreds of institutions had still not been able to retrieve their locked up funds from the collapsed fund management companies. The local currency, the cedi, depreciated by 150% during the second term of his administration. When Nana Addo took office, he made a bold declaration that he was putting his presidency on the line in the fight against illegal mining (galamsey). But by the time he left office, the practice had become widespread with several river bodies polluted beyond disbelief. During the 2024 fiscal year, Ghana’s export proceeds from cocoa production fell to US\$ 1.7 billion, the lowest in 15 years mainly as a result of the effect of illegal mining.


On 7th December 2024, Ghanaians were given the once-in-four-years chance to assess the 2nd term performance of the Akuffo Addo-Bawumia administration. The rest of this report details how the 275 constituencies and the 16 regions across the country assessed their performance.


17 Highlights of the 2024 ratings

- [1] 262 constituencies, representing 95.2%, gave a negative rating to the 2nd- term performance of the just-ended NPP’s administration. Negative rating comprises of “Disapprove”, “Strongly Disapprove” and “Abysmal”.
- [2] 98 constituencies rated the second term as “Abysmal”.
- [3] 120 constituencies said they “Strongly Disapprove” of the 2nd term performance.
- [4] 44 constituencies rated the 2nd term as “Disapprove”.
- [5] 3 constituencies gave the just ended administration positive reviews. They rated the 2nd term as “Strongly Approve”. These constituencies are Walewale in the North East Region, which is also the home constituency of Dr. Mahamudu Bawumia, Nalerigu/Gambaga also in the North East region, and Kpandai in the Northern region.
- [6] No constituency gave a rating of “Approve” or “Excellent” of the 2nd term performance.
- [7] 10 constituencies stayed neutral in their assessment of the second term performance, only stating that the 2nd term was “Acceptable”. These constituencies are Bunkpurugu, Central Tongu, Domeabra/Obom, Manso Adubia, Nkwanta North, Nsawam/Adoagyiri, Salaga South, Sene West, Upper Manya Krobo, and Yagaba/Kubori.
- [8] The Sekondi-Takoradi metropolis was the most dissatisfied city regarding the 2nd term performance of the immediate past administration as all 5 constituencies in the twin-city rated the 2nd term “Abysmal”. These 5 constituencies are also part of the 10 most dissatisfied constituencies in Ghana. They are Takoradi, Sekondi, Effia, Essikado-Ketan, and Kwsimintsim constituencies.
- [9] Berekum West in the Bono region was the most dissatisfied constituency, followed by Binduri in the Upper East region and then Essikado-Ketan in the Western region.
- [10] The Northern, North East and Savannah regions were more measured in their assessment of the 2nd term performance. In all 3 regions, it is only Yendi that rated the 2nd term “Abysmal”.
- [11] Bono was the most dissatisfied region. Eight (8) out of the 12 constituencies rated the 2nd term “Abysmal” while the remaining 4 constituencies rated it as “Strongly Disapprove”. The second most dissatisfied region was Greater Accra and the third was Central.
- [12] 5 regions rated the 2nd term as “Abysmal”. They are Bono, Greater Accra, Central, Western and Upper East.
- [13] 9 regions rated the 2nd term as “Strongly Disapprove”.
- [14] One (1) region, Oti, rated the 2nd term as “Disapprove”.
- [15] The North East Region, the only region to have given the 2nd term a positive rating, rated the performance as “Approve”. Dr. Mahamudu Bawumia comes from the North East Region.
- [16] There is a special class of constituencies that were never impressed by the performance of the NPP in the entire 8 years. They rated both the first term and the second term as “Abysmal”. They are three in number. These are Tarkwa Nsuaem in the Western Region, Upper Denkyira West in the Central Region and Zebilla in the Upper East Region. For these 3 constituencies, the entire 8 years of the Nana Addo led administration is something to be forgotten about.
- [17] The country as a whole rated the second term “Strongly Disapprove”.

RATING METHODOLOGY

The ratings are based on the performance of the New Patriotic Party (NPP) over the two election cycles, 2020 and 2024. We use the percentage of valid votes obtained by the party to model the % increase (decrease) of constituency results on the assumption that the level of percentage increase(decrease) is a direct reflection of voters' perception about the government's performance. A positive % increase represents voters' approval and a negative % increase represents voters' disapproval. A deviation of up to $\pm 2\%$ from the 2020 result is deemed acceptable. The rating model is based on 7 carefully selected outcomes: Excellent, Strongly Approve, Approve, Acceptable, Disapprove, Strongly Disapprove, and Abysmal. In all, 275 constituencies are included in the statistical model. The newly created constituency of Guan is excluded because it does not have historical data for comparison.

The % increase/decrease of the 2024 results over the 2020 result, represented by x , is set out in the criteria below:

Conclusion

Ghanaians did express their displeasure about the 2nd term performance of the just ended administration. At the launch of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana's (PCG) Bicentennial Anniversary on Sunday, December 22, 2024, held at the Osu Castle, the then president, Nana Addo said, "I am confident in all humility, posterity will judge well the Akufo-Addo government's performance. Future generations will look back on this era and say that we laid a strong foundation for progress and prosperity." As to whether he is right or wrong about his own assessment of his tenure, posterity will be the best judge.

In approximately four years from now, Ghanaians will be given the opportunity again to rate the 2nd term performance of the Mahama-led administration. We will see whether Ghanaians will give him a thumps up for a good job done, or he also will receive a repudiation from Ghanaians.
